



Reducing Unintended Pregnancies

Members of the Iowa Initiative are opening a dialogue about the high rate of unintended pregnancies among Iowa women aged 18-30. They aim to reduce this rate through networking, research, public outreach, and by collaborating with providers to increase access to family planning. Although 75% of Iowans say they favor providing uninsured and low income women access to contraception, Iowa only ranks 48th in the country in doing so. Meanwhile, half of pregnancies among Iowa women aged 18-30 are unintended.

Sally Pederson is a senior advisor to the Iowa Initiative. During her time as Lt. Governor of Iowa, from 1999 to 2007, she expanded access to health care for children, required insurance coverage for mental illness, and created affordable housing for people with disabilities. Currently, she chairs the advisory board for a model 2-year college program at the University of Iowa for students with multiple learning disabilities. She is also a trustee of Union Theological Seminary in New York, a director of the Northwest Area Foundation, and co-chair of the capital campaign for the Des Moines Pastoral Counseling Center.

The Latehomecomer




October 12, at 4:30 pm, Cedar Valley Discuss & Discover Diversity (CV3D) will host Kao Kalia Yang, author of *The Latehomecomer*, at the Cedar Falls Public Library. Yang will be discussing her memoir, her life as a second generation Hmong. Her appearance is the result of a collaboration of the Cedar Falls Branch of AAUW, UNI's Center for Multicultural Education, the Cedar Falls Public Library, the UNI Museums, the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance, the Waterloo Center for the Arts, and University Book and Supply. Ms. Yang's memoir invites

readers and listeners to learn of her family's harrowing escape from Laos, their life in refugee camps and their eventual emigration and adjustment to life in America. From your co-presidents ~ 2010 Iowa AAUW Conference ~ Make Plans Now

Lilly Ledbetter will be the featured speaker at the 2010 AAUW State Conference. This grandmother sued Goodyear Tire & Rubber for pay discrimination, a suit that went to the Supreme Court and enabled the passage of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act in 2009. Ledbetter's presentation epitomizes this year's branch theme: Woman Unbound. The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act is named after a woman who was paid less than her male co-workers at an Alabama tire factory. Ledbetter did not set out to be an activist; she did not even involve herself in politics much. She was a good hard worker who did her job, and did it well, for nearly two decades before discovering that for years she was paid less than her male colleagues for the very same work. Over the course of her career, she lost more than \$200,000 in salary and even more in pension and Social Security benefits. These are losses she still feels today because the Supreme Court ruled against her. It was then that she decided it was time to be an activist and that activism resulted in passage of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act signed into law last year.



Tara Thomas, news anchor at KWWL, will speak on Saturday and Dr. Sharon DuClos of Waterloo will close the Saturday conference by speaking on "Equity Issues in Medicine." International students, including our own Jacque Ingibire will be one of the breakout speakers. Dr. Judy Beckman will present a coffee and book talk for early risers at 7 a.m. on Saturday. The Cedar Falls Branch of AAUW is a substantial contributor to this conference. Sherman Alexie's latest book, *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-time Indian* is the discussion topic for the November 9, CV3D (Cedar Valley Discover Diversity Discuss). The meeting is scheduled at 4:30-5:30 p.m. at the UNI Museum. There is no charge for attending and participants need not have read the book to attend.

Junior is a Spokane Indian, born on the reservation with a myriad of medical problems. His fondest hopes include being a cartoonist and getting a fine education, even if this means leaving his best friend Rowdy and going off to public school. Wouldn't you know that the only other Native American in his new high school is the school's mascot! Junior spends his youth trying to escape marginality and fitting into the successful world when he becomes an adult. Readers will be curious to know how much of Sherman Alexie's own life on the Spokane Reservation is captured in this poignant and genuinely funny novel.

CV3D discussions are sponsored by the Cedar Falls Branch of AAUW, the Cedar Falls/ Waterloo Public Libraries, and the UNI Museums. The UNI Museum is located on Hudson Road and University Avenue, Cedar Falls, and is handicap accessible.
