50-50 in 2020

September 22 marked the start of a ten year campaign by a new bipartisan organization, 50-50 in 2020, to elect more Iowa women to public office. The group is headed by Democrat Jean Lloyd-Jones and Republican Maggie Tinsman and has a 14 member board. Working with other state and national groups they will recruit, train and mentor women who are interested in running for public office. Their goal is to achieve political equity in Iowa by 2020, the one hundred year anniversary of women's suffrage, by electing: 50 women to the Iowa House of Representatives, 25 women to the Iowa Senate, 2 Iowa women to the U.S. House of Representatives, 1 Iowa woman to the U.S. Senate and a woman governor of Iowa. They aim to achieve civility and respect among political opponents, are not a PAC, will not endorse candidates and are committed to being issue-neutral. One of the members of the Board is former Lt. Governor Joy Corning, a Cedar Falls branch 50 Year Honorary Life Member. AAUW Iowa is a partner organization.
