Cedar Falls Woman's Club Restoration Project

Recognizing AAUW's collective appreciation and concern for the lovely house where we hold our meetings. I appreciate the opportunity to share information about the restoration of the house. About six years ago a focus group of community members and CFWC members held meetings to assess structural and decorative concerns of the Victorian house built in 1867, purchased by the Woman's Club in 1929, and found it very "needy". An architectural study of all aspects led to a total restoration cost of \$907,000. First priority was to replace the leaking roof, rotting fascia, gutters and mental coverings of the dormer windows. The cost of this part of the total project was \$83,000. It is completed and paid in full.

The second priority is to make the south entrance handicap accessible with a ground level, double door entrance and an inside ramp to the dining room. This same project included new restrooms that are handicap accessible for guests confined to wheel chairs or those using a walker. The new area includes a small office, a nice change from the closet which the manager now uses. The cost is projected at \$175,000 with architects' fees and contingency funds bringing the total to \$220,000. This is a big price but the house will have a safe for all seasons entrance and be truly in compliance with the American Disability Act.

The \$165,000 we have raised so far for this project has come from individuals, organizations that meet at the Woman's Club and \$40,000 in grant monies. All monies are received by the Cedar Falls Civic Foundation, our 501C3 fiscal agent. No monies are channeled through the Woman's Club treasury. Donors' checks should be made out to the Cedar Falls Civic Foundation with the memo line marked CFWC Building Fund. All donations are tax deductible. Donors may send their checks directly to the Civic Foundation or to the Woman's Club at 304 Clay Street.

Please do consider contributing to the restoration project. The Woman's Club needs your help to meet the goal and proceed with this important project.
