Report From the Board of Directors

The Board met on February 3, 2008 and Pramode Sarin reported on the locally and nationally recognized International Friendship Program at UNI. She reminded members that this organization was started in 1965 by the Cedar Falls Branch and encouraged its inclusion as a Community Action Project.

President Gloria Tollefson challenged all members to read "What's Next for AAUW?" published in the Fall/Winter 2008 issue of *Outlook*.

The Board approved removing the line item for Scholarship and reallocating the budgeted amount to Community Action. Also approved was placing International Friendship into Community Action.

The electronic newsletter saves \$50.00 for each time it's published with a total savings of \$350 for the year.

A one-time project was approved for the solicitation of supplies and funds for materials to support Marilyn Busch, the speaker for the March dinner meeting, as she works as a volunteer for handicapped school children in Russia.
