





Monday, February 11, Zach Wahls' memoir, *My Two Moms*, will be discussed at the University Book and Supply classroom. Leading the discussion will be Jennifer Waldron, Associate Professor in HPLES at the University of Northern Iowa. Jennifer and her



spouse, Brenda Fite, are the parents of a son, Lloyd.

Dr. Waldron and her spouse think highly of Zach Wahls and hope their own son will not have to endure the struggles that Zach and his two mothers encountered with a same sex marriage. Dr. Waldron and Dr. Fite find the Cedar Valley a welcoming place to live, but have also have been assaulted by a car full of people shouting homophobic slurs at the family.

All Cedar Valley residents are welcome at the February 11 discussion. The UB&S classroom is handicap equipped. Discussion begins at 4:30 pm, and usually ends at 5:30. This event does not require participants to have read the book in advance of the discussion.


