
Remember, your grad will receive a one-year, at-large membership — a \$49 value - for free. They can join a branch at any time but will be responsible for paying branch and state dues.

WILD: From Lost to Found on the Pacific Crest Trail by Cheryl Strayed



Cheryl Strayed felt bereft when at 22, her mother died. Her family scattered after the death and her marriage fell to pieces. *WILD* is Strayed's memoir of her 1,100 mile solo hike up the Pacific rest Trail from the Mohave Desert through California and Oregon to Washington State. Readers will see this lost young woman grow and develop into a strong, reflective woman. The trip made in *WILD* is not made by a seasoned hiker. Cheryl Strayed is a "first-time" solo traveler. Her initial experience becomes vividly clear that first night she packed into her sleeping bag - alone.

Cedar Valley readers are engrossed in reading about Cheryl's trip. Readers feel the fear of rattle snakes, the black bears, the cold snow and intense heat during the day. Feel the readers' uncertainty when one of her own hiking boots goes over the cliff. Imagine the plan to pack a back pack. What is truly essential. What appears to be, except when those essentials become too heavy to heft. Those imperative articles rearrange their priority when they must be forced to be jettisoned if Cheryl must be able to close the pack and heft it for a day's walk.

Readers become engrossed in Strayed's search for herself. Cedar Valley residents who have not yet read the book will find increasing desire to add *WILD* to their personal stack of "must reads." AAUW, the Waterloo and Cedar Falls Public Libraries, and University Book & Supply are cosponsors. The Cedar Falls Discover Diversity & Discuss event will be held in the University Book & Supply first floor handicap accessable classroom. Discussion will begin at 4:30 pm and end about 5:30.

The discussion will be made more vivid by the discussion leader, Erica Billerbeck a conservation officer for the Iowa Department of Natural Resources in Johnson County, and author of The Warden's Diary in the Iowa Outdoors Magazine, who is a well-seasoned climber and camper. Join in and grow in Strayed's effort to journey to heal herself.


