Beginning this month, AAUW members have the option to receive a digital only version of the **Outlook** publication or the print and digital version.



Burma-Iowa Friends



> Background: Burma (often called Myanmar) is a Southeast Asia country bordered by India,

Bangladesh, China, Laos and Thailand. Since 2006 after decades of political & mili-tary problems, 15,000 Burmese have immigrated to the US.

> Resettlement in Waterloo: In the past two years nearly 1000 refugees have resettled in Waterloo mostly drawn by employment at Tyson Fresh Meats with about 250 working there. They speak a variety of languages at home but an increasing number speak English and their children are learning in school. This summer brought more than 500 refugees, including 100 children.

> Burma-Iowa Friends: Burma-Iowa Friends has organized to help provide the needed services. Local agencies, organizations and individuals serve on the steering committee, as well as AAUW members from Cedar Falls and Waterloo branches.

Remember to sign up at the AAUW Public Policy website. Click on Action and then click on the Two Minute Activist. Next, scroll down to the bottom of the page where you can sign up for both the Two Minute Activist and Megavote. These sites allow you to have a voice in the issues which AAUW support and gives updates on recent bills and votes.

Google, or do a websearch for the AAUW Congressional Voting Record 2012 release. You can view the bills AAUW advocated that came to a vote during the past year. Records of votes and percentage of time AAUW issues were supported are tallied for U.S. Representatives and Senators from Iowa. Keep these voting records in mind when voting this November.
