

Molly Guptill Manning. This New York TIMES review tells readers that this book not only illuminates the seldom discussed details of a slice of of World War II history, and most readers know nothing about. It also reminds readers in a digital era of movies and TV, how powerfully written literature once was enjoyed by lovers of books. It also created and made readers of eleventh grade infantry men, who previous to their war, experienced nothing, but assigned reading from their school years. This is a reading experience that will appeal to history lovers and book lovers alike.

The discussion of *When The War Went To War* will be led by CV3D co-chair Dr. Judy Beckman. All Cedar Valley residents are invited to join the discussion even if they have not yet read the title.
