



Enrique's Journey: Broken Families, Broken Borders

This look at the current political discussion on the immigrants who are in the United States and those trying to make the journey as well is underscored by Nazario's title.

We tend to think of the desperate immigrants who risk to make it into the United States as adults. This title is a story of a seven year old boys, lonesome for the mother who left Honduras illegally in search of work to support her Honduran children. Dr. Jennifer Cooley will be the guest speaker for this compelling odyssey derived from the Pulitzer Prize winning Los Angeles TIMES series. Although Nazario didn't accompany Enrique on his journey she tells the story from his perspective having interviewed him and hundred of other immigrants making the trip. Nazario made the same trip herself several times in order to write the book.

Join the April 10 guests to examine an experience that effort to search for work in America and a seven year old who searches for the city where his mother in search of a steady income to support her children.


