
Happy New Year everyone!! We hope to see all of you at our first brunch this year. It will be January 26 and will have an exciting program which you will read about in this newsletter.

A GENTLEMAN IN MOSCOW

Amor Towles

Monday, January 14, second Monday of the month, Cedar Valley Discover Diversity will discuss Amor Towles' novel A GENTLEMAN IN MOSCOW.



The discussion will begin be held in the Cedar Falls Public Library's large discussion room 4:30 - 6 pm.

Count Alexander Roscov, aristocrat who has enjoyed the luxuries of life, until at the end of the Russian Revolution with other aristocrats, will be killed or imprisoned. Unlike most others, Roscov is spared Siberia and worse because of a revolutionary poem he supposedly wrote that predated the Russian Revolution. This leniency gains him life but vacates him from his suite in the most luxurious hotel, the Metropol, and will move him to a tiny servant's room too small for even a few of his beautiful furnishing, as well as sharing a bathroom with the six other similar tenants. Roscov will spend the rest of his life under this hotel arrest. Should he attempt escape, he is to be killed.

Readers accompany Roscov's thirty-two years of captivity through which he must practice mastering his circumstances or be mastered by them. Readers wonder what keeps him from committing suicide, even in the face of his becoming a mere waiter in Russia's most famous restaurant in this world of Soviet supremacy and class obsolescence. Is it possible for Roscov to ever escape his class diminution and see the outside world beyond the mere window views? Join Mary Dove's expertise in examining a life that may lead to personally unraveling in imprisonment and produce fatal blows leading to despondency and death.

Nouran Othman was the recipient of the Transition Scholarship, to the University of Northern Iowa in May 2018. Because of financial difficulty, Nouran continued her studies at Hawkeye Community College through the fall semester.

The Board has authorized that she receive the full \$1,000 scholarship this (spring 2019) semester as she begins study at UNI, where she plans to major in accounting and public administration.

Transition Scholarships are awarded in the spring to female students age 23+ currently attending HCC who will enroll in at least six credit hours at UNI in the fall. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on at least 30 transferrable credit hours from HCC.
