



The room will be open at 4:15 pm and the discussion will begin promptly at 4:30 pm. Recognizing the adoption of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution the discussion will be. ROSES AND RADICALS: The Epic Story of How Women Won the Vote. The facilitator will be Mary Dove.

STEM Competition at UNI

AAUW is a recognized leader in addressing the need for STEM opportunities for girls. This fall our branch was asked to provide volunteers for a FIRST LEGO League STEM competion at Peet Junior High. Thanks to three branch members, Karen Agee, Ardelle Brown, and Sandy Lawry, who stepped-up to help.

UNI is hosting the FIRST®? Robotics Competition (FRC) Iowa Regional at the McLeod Center on March 25-28. Combining the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology, it will bring together more than 45 FRC teams from the Midwest and around the world. Each high school team will design, build, and program their robot to play this year's game, INFINITE RECHARGESM. The teams will include girls and boys, not just girls.

We've again been asked to help. Volunteers are needed for - - -

- 1. Quiet Room Attendant: supervise a room where students who need to get away from the noise and excitement can go. This would be a minimum of 1/2 day commitments. (Always 2 adults in the room at a time)
- 2. Welcome Table Attendant: welcome people to the event and give out programs. Answer simple questions and call for a planning committee member when needed. This would be a minimum of 1/2 day commitments.


