Daring to be a Man Among Men by Dr. Brice D. Smith is the CV3D book for Monday, February 10 at 4:30 at the Cedar Falls Public Library. The book is about Lou Sullivan born in 1951 and died of AIDS in 1991. He marched for Civil Rights, embraced the Counterculture of the 60's, came of age in the gay liberation movement. He transformed medical treatment of trans people, institutionalized trans history, and forged an international female to male (FTM) transgender community. He died of AIDS at the epicenter of the crisis. This man overcame tremendous obstacles to be who he was and dedicated his life to helping others do the same. Activist to the end, Sullivan inspired a generation to rethink gender identity, sexual orientation, and WHAT IT MEANS TO BE HUMAN

Jennifer Christiason, will speak about the new program she and her husband, Dr. Kyle Christiason have developed at Unity Point to serve the medical needs of LGBTQ.
