

We need many volunteers for this event and members attending along with many others in the community. Cost is expected to be \$30 per person for advance ticket sales or \$35 at the door.



ELOQUENT RAGE: A Black Woman Discovers Her Superpower By

Dr. Brittney Cooper

On Monday, March 9 at 4:30 pm, CV3D examines an important modern look at Modern Femininity. Brittney Cooper, highly recognized writer, intellectual, and educator at Rutgers University's most recent title, ELOQUENT RAGE asks readers to uncover *fourth wave feminism*. Professor Cooper defines Modern Feminism as an intersection of gender, race, and Black women and their experiences. Cooper writes with fire and rage that feminism did not begin with Susan B. Anthony but a with a Black lady abolitionist Maria Stewart. Today she asserts and examines what feminist politics actually means in the daily lives of Black women. This feminist distinction insists Black women must care for and have the back of the women in their lives.

All residents of the Cedar Valley are invited and welcomed to the discussion of this must read. It is a title you can pick up on a bookstore shelf that embraces what female anger can achieve. CV3D is a Community Action Project of AAUW Cedar Falls-Waterloo seeking lively discussions of diverse populations. Meetings are from 4:30-6:00 p.m. in the second floor Hardman Room.
