

Cedar Valley Discuss Discover Diversity (CV3D) gathered with the help of Zoom on April 12 to discuss the novel, *The Vanishing Half* by Brit Bennet. Thank you to Gloria Tollefson for leading the discussion to thirteen CV3D members.



On May 10, 2021, CV3D will gather in Lookout Park in Cedar Falls to discuss the novel *The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek,* by Kim Michele Richardson. The discussion will be held at 4:30-5:30 via Zoom. An email invitation will be sent out on Friday, May 7, 2021, with the link to join our Monday discussion.

The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a historical fiction story. It is also a story about the power of books and the dedication of the heroine, Cussy Mary, to make sure she delivers books to her patrons all while navigating a community steeped in racial intolerance. It is set in 1936 in the mountains of Kentucky, and 19-year-old Cussy Mary Carter works for The New Deal-funded Pack Horse Librarians. It is a powerful story of hope, heartbreak, poverty, oppression,

strength, and the belief that books can take you anywhere. Richardson adds a historical gem to the story when we learn that Cussy Mary is also one of the blue people. *The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek* gives us much to discuss! We look forward to hearing your thoughts and insights on May 10 and so hope you can join us.

See The Suffragist in July

Nancy Hill Cobb, composer and executive director of *The Suffragist*, has announced that the musical will be performed this July. We are very lucky that the event will be at the Gallagher Bluedorn performing arts center at UNI. People will come for all of Iowa to see this!

The Gallagher Bluedorn will still be operating in a reduced capacity for safety reasons. The audience size will be limited to around 400 for each performance (in a hall that seats 1600), and audience members will be seated in "pods" of about 2-4 people and then socially distanced and masked. Nancy reports that because of reduced audience size, there will be five performances instead of three. Those performances will be on Friday, July 16 at 7 p.m., Saturday, July 17 at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m., and Sunday, July 18 at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Tickets will not go on sale until June 1. Branch board members with tickets purchased last year have chosen to attend the opening night performance on Friday, July 16. We will send out reminders as we get more information.

In 1980 Erma Bombeck came to town to help promote passage of the Equal Rights Amendment in Iowa. The event was sponsored by the League of Women Voters and both Cedar Falls and Waterloo branches of AAUW. Erma was a tireless supporter of the ERA. The Cedar Falls and Waterloo branches had a brunch with our special guest, Barbara Rowe. She assumed the role of Susan B. Anthony to emphasize the importance of equal rights for women.
