

Scholarship News!

The Tuition Scholarship guidelines and application form are now available on our website: https://cedarfalls-ia.aauw.net/ Click on Activities and then Scholarships and you will find a link to the form. Please let your friends, relatives, and others know about this opportunity. The award for this next year is \$2000, with half applied to each of two semesters. Applicants need to be planning to go to Allen College, Hawkeye Community College, or the University of Northern Iowa. Deadline for applications is May 1, 2022. Thanks for your help in making people aware of this.

The Waterloo-Cedar Falls AAUW branch offers two types of scholarships each year. One is a tuition scholarship, which provides a \$2000 award to a woman attending Allen College, Hawkeye Community College, or the University of Northern Iowa. This is awarded in late May/early June. The amount of this award was recently raised from \$1500 to \$2000 for the 2022-23 academic year. The other scholarship is a textbook scholarship for refugee women. An award of \$500 may be made to a maximum of three women attending college at one of the above listed colleges and also Wartburg. This may be used for textbooks and other academic materials or expenses.

Both types of scholarships aid women and provide encouragement as they pursue their education. This past year, four tuition scholarships (of \$1500 each) were awarded and one textbook scholarship. Our current scholarship committee consists of Marilyn Drury, Chair; Mary Dove; Nancy Henderson; and Linda Morgan. The Chair attempts to stay in contact with the recipients throughout the year and until they graduate, providing any additional support possible.

The scholarships and contact throughout the year are greatly appreciated by the recipients. In our next newsletter, April 2022, one of our tuition recipients will be featured.
