

Cedar Valley Discuss and Discover Diversity (CV3D)

On **Monday, November 14**, CV3D will gather to discuss *When The Apricots Bloom*, by Gina Wilkinson. The discussion will be held in person, **4:30-6:00**, at the large meeting room of the Cedar Falls Public Library.

This is historical fiction set in Iraq during Saddam Hussein's rule. The author draws from her experience while stationed in Baghdad as a foreign correspondent for BBC, NPR, and ABC. A close Iraqi friend was an informant for Saddam's secret police. Wilkinson wondered, would they have been friends despite this or was it just a job for her? That question formed the starting point for her novel.

A secretary, an artist, and a diplomat's wife each must confront living the complexities of Saddam Hussein's rule. Trust, friendship, and motherhood under the rule of the dictator and his ruthless secret police are harrowing. These richly-drawn characters create a suspenseful read. Gina Wilkinson wrote, "Through two decades of living in hotspots across the globe, I've found that while we might pray in a certain way, cover our hair or not, bake our bread flat or leavened, at heart we all want the same things—safety, peace, love. We share far more in common than that which divides us. I hope this book shows that."

We hope you join us on November 14 for this discussion. Even if you haven't read the book, you are welcome to attend. We would like to thank Pauline Harding for leading our October discussion of *Grey Bees*, by Andrey Kurkov. It was a timely topic and the good discussion for the eight participants. Cedar Valley SWE Girls Conference

On behalf of the Cedar Valley Society of Women Engineers Girls Conference Planning Committee, we appreciate the donation of \$200 by the AAUW Cedar Falls-Waterloo Branch. This funding will allow 20 girls grades 5-8 who otherwise could not afford the \$10 registration fee to attend the event or assist us in providing all girls with lunch at the event. A donation of any size supports local girls learning about STEM careers.

The Cedar Valley SWE Girls Conference is scheduled for Saturday, December 3, 2022, at McCollum Science Hall, University of Northern Iowa. We hope to reach 100 local girls this year. A dozen local STEM professionals will lead sessions in science and engineering topics.

It would be very helpful if local AAUW members would volunteer to manage check-in again. We usually have 3-4 volunteers who check in at 8:30 AM and help set up the girl registration area. Then they check in the girls and hand out schedules and t-shirts as they arrive at McCollum Science Hall, 9:00—9:30 AM. The volunteers would then turn in any unclaimed materials with the list of no-shows to the volunteer registration desk. At that point they can leave but are welcome to stay for the keynote presentation, 9:30-10:00, if they wish.

AAUW members who have volunteered in the past may not recognize the new event name. It was formerly called "Expanding Your Horizons" or "EYH." The licensing for EYH has been purchased by a new organization that drastically changed the event, fees, and supports, so we decided to create our own event based on past successes. The girls still get to participate in a keynote presentation and three hands-on activity sessions.
