

Cedar Valley Discuss and Discover Diversity (CV3D)

On **Monday, April 10**, CV3D will gather to discuss *Code Talker: The First and Only memoir by One of the Original Navajo Code Talkers of WWII,* written by Chester Nez with Judith Schiess Avila. The discussion will be held at **4:30-6:00 PM** in the Cedar Falls Public Library conference room.

In this inspiring memoir, the author (assigned the name Chester Nez in a BIA boarding school) shares experiences during World War II and his life growing up in the Checkerboard Area on the Navajo Reservation. Mr. Nez, a 2001 recipient of the Congressional Honor Medal, is one of the original 29 "code talkers," who developed a secret code using the Navajo language. Because Japanese decoders

were unable to decipher it, this code kept Marine radio communications secret in the Pacific Theater of Operations.

Join us as we discuss warfare, patriotism, language and communication, and much more. Mr. Nez' memoir will also help us understand the Diné or Navajo culture. What does the author mean when he says he believed in living the "Right Way"? How did the Diné use corn pollen? Join us on April 10 to discuss *Code Talker*. Even if you haven't read the book, come and join our discussion. To explore the code talkers, you may want to watch the film, *Windtalkers*, or listen to interviews with other code talkers at <u>https://navajocodetalkers.org/</u>
