

This year, CV3D is focusing on banned books. On Monday, October 9, CV3D will gather to discuss the third most challenged book in 2022, *The Bluest Eye*, by Toni Morrison. The discussion will be held **4:30**-**5:30** at the Cedar Falls Public Library conference room.

Since the publication of *The Bluest Eye* in 1970, there have been numerous attempts to ban it from schools and libraries because of its depiction of sex, violence, racism, incest, and child molestation. It frequents the American Library Association's list of banned and challenged books.

Through her main character, Pecola, Morrison shows readers that black was not always beautiful. *The Bluest Eye* will have you reflecting

on how perceptions of beauty can determine an individual's sense of self-worth and capacity for self-love. *The Bluest Eye* will also have us discussing race and class.
