

"God, I'm sick of having my books banned. This time: *My Sister's Keeper, Mercy,* and *19 Minutes* in a suburb of Des Moines, Iowa," said Jodi Picoult on September 1, as reported in *The Des Moines Register*.

This year CV3D is focusing on banned books. On Monday,
November 13, CV3D will gather to discuss Nineteen Minutes by
Jodi Picoult. The Urbandale Community School District has
banned Nineteen Minutes because state law now orders
removal of books depicting sex acts. Do you agree that this book
should be banned from schools? Join the discussion 4:30-5:30
PM at the Cedar Falls Public Library conference room.

What can you do in 19 minutes? You can bake cookies, order a pizza and get it delivered, read a story to a child, OR you can stop the world and get revenge. Our main character, Peter, gets revenge when he opens fire on his school, and the town of

Sterling is left to take a closer look at its shortcomings.

Picoult's *Nineteen Minutes* is a suspenseful, harrowing and oh-so-difficult-to-read book, but gun violence continues in our schools and *Nineteen Minutes* continues to be relevant. Join our discussion to share your thoughts about bullying, love, loss, parenting, and banned books.
