

On Monday, November 11, CV3D will gather to discuss A Woman of No Importance: The Untold Story of the American Spy Who Helped Win World War II, by Sonia Purnell. The discussion will be held 4:30-5:30 at the Cedar Falls Public Library conference room.

There is always more history to tell, even in a topic as exhaustively covered as World War II. This Veterans' Day we will be honoring WWII veteran Virginia Hall by discussing this war hero's remarkable service to our country.

Hall defied her mother's plan that she marry rich as well as gender-role obstacles deployed by often bumbling males, many of them officers who outranked her. She recruited peasants and prostitutes as spies, masterminded prison escapes, and organized parachute drops of weapons such as fake horse dung that exploded if driven over. Probably her most vexing concerns were dealing with fellow spies who were incompetent, resented taking orders from a woman, or dismissed her accomplishments. Virginia Hall never gave up!

Please join us on November 11, even if you haven't read the book. All are welcome. And thanks go to Lorene Wellnitz, who led the October discussion on *Lessons in Chemistry*. Thirteen of us shared ideas about gender inequality, sexism, and overcoming tragedy.

Next year we will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Cedar Falls branch of AAUW. The Waterloo branch was chartered in 1919. We are now the Cedar Falls-Waterloo branch after the two joined together in the 2017-18 membership year. We recognized the Waterloo branch centennial in 2019.

We will be planning activities related to the centennial. Honoring Lilly Ledbetter – The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2009

Lilly Ledbetter, who passed away in October, was an advocate for equal pay for women. When she discovered that her pay was not commensurate with that of her male colleagues at Goodyear, she sued under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; however, because her suit didn't meet the requirements of the law at that time, her suit was denied. To remedy this situation, Ms. Ledbetter along with AAUW and other organizations petitioned Congress to pass a fair pay act -- the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2009. Lilly Ledbetter was a speaker at the Iowa AAUW state convention in 2010.

Since then, AAUW has advocated for additional legislation – the Paycheck Fairness Act – that would provide other protections for equal pay for equal work. This Act has been introduced several times, the latest in 2023. It has not yet passed both houses of Congress.
