

On Monday, January 13, CV3D will gather to discuss, *Crow Mary* by Kathleen Grissom. The discussion will be a hybrid session: gather in person **4:30-5:30** at the Cedar Falls Public Library conference room or join the discussion through Zoom. A Zoom link will be sent via email on January 10.

Crow Mary is a historical novel that traces the life story of Goes First, or Crow Mary, a real-life Indigenous woman of the Crow nation who lived in North America (Montana and Canada) in the 1870s. Grissom tells a story of colonial trauma, Indigenous survival, cultural conflict, and love.

Goes First desires to be brave like a warrior and is taught that bravery is not fearlessness but defiance of fear. She exhibits incredible resilience against awful men. Do you see her actions as a triumph of individual courage or as a broader statement about the strength of Indigenous women in the face of colonial oppression?

We look forward to hearing your thoughts about *Crow Mary* on January 13. Even if you haven't read the book, please join the discussion. All are welcome.

We thank Kathryn Rogers, who led the November discussion on *A Woman of No Importance* with 12 participants. In that discussion we shared our thoughts about overcoming tragedy and defying gender roles, inequality, and sexism.

Special Election on Tuesday, January 28

Black Hawk County has scheduled a special election to fill the vacant Black Hawk County Supervisor position following Dan Trelka's resignation. More specific information, as well as absentee ballot request forms, can be found on the county auditor's website: https://blackhawkcountyelections.iowa.gov/elections/info/black hawk county supervisor vacancy 2025 01 28/#ballots.

Important dates and information:

- The Special Election will be held on Tuesday, January 28.
- Vote Center locations will be open from 7:00 AM. to 8:00 PM on Election Day. Voters can vote at **any one** of the locations in the county, regardless of residential precinct.

- Absentee ballot request forms can be accepted now for the Special Election.
- The first day that absentee ballots can be mailed out is Wednesday, January 8.
- Absentee voting in person will begin on Wednesday, January 8, in the Election Office at the Courthouse (Room 213).
- The deadline to submit an absentee ballot request form is 5:00 PM on Monday, January 13. Absentee ballot request forms must be in the office by 5:00 PM. Postmarks do not count!
- The pre-registration deadline for voter registration closes at 5:00 PM. Monday, January 13, for the Special Election.
- Please note, the Election Office will be closed on Monday, January 20, in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.
- In-person absentee voting at the Courthouse will end at 4:30 PM. on Monday, January 27.
- Voted absentee ballots must be received in the Election Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election
 Day. Voters casting their absentee ballot pursuant to UOCAVA or Safe at Home should
 review their absentee ballot instructions for additional guidance.
- Voters will need to provide identification at the polls. <u>Click here for additional</u> information.
- The Election Office will be open to answer general questions.
- There will be no voting at the Election Office on Election Day.
