# **Cedar Valley Legislative Public Forums**



#### **Dues Information**

Shannon Wolfe, AAUW (National) Managing Director and Chief of Staff

This winter, the AAUW Board proposed an increase in dues and invited members to comment through January 29. Annual dues are currently \$72. Soon the Board will notify members whether it has adopted the proposed five-year plan for annual \$5 dues increases:

- April 1, 2025–\$77. April 1, 2026–\$82. April 1, 2027–\$87. April 1, 2028–\$92. April 1, 2029–\$97.
- After April 1, 2025, lifetime dues would be \$1,540.
- Dues cover about 15% of AAUW's operating budget and do not cover the cost of member support. Dues increases will cover more of the cost of member support and accommodate inflation.
- An increase in Student or College/University dues is not under consideration in 2025.

Are you concerned about what is happening in Congress and our Iowa Legislature? Do you want to take action but want something easy to do? Here are a few ideas:

Easy Action #1. Became an AAUW Two-Minute Activist! When you join AAUW's Action Network, you will receive email notifications from AAUW about bills or issues that need your attention. AAUW will provide the information and the email to send to your senator or representative in Congress.

To sign up for the Two-Minute Activist:
On your computer, go to whatever search engine you use (Google, Yahoo, etc.)
Type in "AAUW Two-Minute Activist"
Click on "Join Our Action Network"
Click on "Sign Up" and follow the directions

Just log in to your AAUW membership account (or create an account if you don't have one).

Then, back on the main page of AAUW org, look for "Take Action" at the top, hover over it and the

Easy Action #2. **Get the 5Calls App on your phone and/or computer!** 5Calls is an organization that researches issues and then puts together talking points you can use to call your Congressional legislators. 5Calls will help keep track of your action, if you choose to report. It's easy to use.

To get 5Calls on your computer, just type in "5Calls" on a search engine. You will eventually need to type in your address/zip code for 5Calls to work as designed.

To get the free 5Calls app on your phone, On your Iphone, go to the App Store and look for 5Calls. On your Android, go to Google Play and search for 5Calls.

### **Scholarship News**

We are in the midst of collecting applications for our scholarship. Several have been submitted already. Please remind those you know or those who may be eligible to apply by May 1.

As a reminder, here are the criteria: Applicants must have a minimum postsecondary cumulative GPA of 2.5 or more and must plan to attend the University of Northern Iowa, Hawkeye Community College, or Allen College during the next academic year. Applicants must enroll in at least 9 credit hours each semester in pursuit of an undergraduate degree.

Applicants will be considered without regard to race, creed, sexual orientation, national origin, age, socioeconomic status, or disability. Priority may be given to applicants who show greatest financial need, who reside in Benton, Black Hawk, Bremer, Buchanan, Butler, Fayette, Grundy, or Tama County who are majoring in a non-traditional field of study.

**Stronger Together**. That's the name of an AAUW lowa initiative to collaborate with other likeminded organizations on issues. In addition to working with other organizations, we are stronger when we use our voices to communicate with our elected officials who are supposed to be working for us.

If you haven't already acted, see the email sent to members on March 3, asking you to take action by **contacting House Education Committee members in support of HF 543**, a bill that requires period products in half the public school bathrooms and includes a provision for an appropriation (July 1, 2025, thru June 30, 2028) for the districts to receive reimbursement from the Department of Education for the actual cost of the products.

Also, please be sure to **read and take action** when you receive notification about legislation from our Public Policy Director Nancy Henderson—even if you think it won't matter. Our voices need to be heard.
