

### **How to Take Action**

Are you concerned about what is happening in Congress, in our nation and our state? Do you want to take action but want something easy to do? Here are a few ideas:

**1. Became an AAUW Two-Minute Activist!** By joining AAUW's Two-Minute Activist, you will receive email notifications from AAUW about bills or issues that need your attention. AAUW will provide the information and the email to send to your senator or representative in Congress.

To sign up for the Two-Minute Activist:

- On your computer, go to whatever search engine you use (Google, Yahoo, etc.)
- Type in "AAUW Two-Minute Activist"
- Click on "Join Our Action Network"
- Click on "Sign Up" and follow the directions OR

Just log in to your AAUW membership account (or create an account if you don't have one). Then, back on the main page of AAUW.org, look for "Take Action" at the top, hover over it and then click on "Two-Minute Activist" then click on "Sign Up" and follow the directions.

2. Get the 5Calls App on your phone and/or computer! 5Calls is an organization that researches issues and then puts together talking points you can use to call your Congressional legislators. 5Calls will help keep track of your action, if you choose to report. It's easy to use.

To get 5Calls on your computer, just type in "5Calls" on a search engine. You will eventually need to type in your address/zip code for 5Calls to work as designed.

To get the 5Calls app on your phone (it's free),

- On your Iphone, go to the App Store and look for 5Calls.
- On your Android, go to Google Play and search for 5Calls.
- **3. Sign up with me to receive a weekly list of legislation** from the lowa legislature we are monitoring. Email me at nancyhenderson2023@gmail.com to be added to the list.

**4. Sign up with Fast Democracy** at <a href="https://fastdemocracy.com/">https://fastdemocracy.com/</a> to track legislation in the lowa legislature as well as in Congress. Fast Democracy also has an app available for your phone, whether Iphone or Android:

## **Keeping Track of Legislative Action**

The lowa state legislature is less than one month away from its scheduled last day, May 2nd. However, we know that when the legislature hasn't finished its business, their work may continue beyond that date. As of this writing, there has been no agreement on K-12 public school funding, and appropriations for a state budget have not been worked out. And, there are several bills that have passed the 2nd funnel that still need to be debated. You can keep up with the bills that are being debated in the House and the Senate by going to <a href="https://www.legis.iowa.gov/">https://www.legis.iowa.gov/</a> and clicking on the respective debate calendars, highlighted in yellow. These calendars are usually updated the day before, so be sure to check periodically to see what is being debated so you can let your legislator (and other legislators) know of your concerns. The Index lists the previous debate calendars.
